

FAQs

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

All North Vancouver businesses and residents that own video surveillance cameras and want to help fight crime in their community.

HOW DOES THE REGISTRY WORK?

Using computer software, the North Vancouver RCMP has built a registry of business and residential addresses that own video surveillance cameras. These addresses will be overlayed on a geographical map.

HOW DO POLICE USE THE REGISTRY?

If a crime is committed in your neighbourhood, police will look at the map registry to see if your or your neighbours' surveillance cameras has captured evidence of the crime. If it did, and with your consent, police will use this evidence in their investigation and potentially provide it to court. Please note that it is unlikely you will ever have to go to court. Even if you provide video evidence, you weren't a witness to the crime. The video speaks for itself.

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE A CAMERA BUT I WANT TO PARTICIPATE?

If you would like to participate you must have a functioning surveillance camera installed on your property.

DOES IT MATTER WHAT KIND OF SECURITY CAMERA IT IS?

It just needs to record video footage that can be retrieved and replayed.

MY CAMERA IS LIVE FOOTAGE ONLY. CAN I STILL SIGN UP?

The registry is only for cameras that actually record video footage that can be retrieved and replayed.

DOES THIS GIVE THE POLICE ACCESS TO MY CAMERA FOOTAGE AND MONITORING?

No, this only enables us to identify which camera owners have registered camera location(s) when investigating an incident.
We may contact you, using your email address, to request access to review recorded video footage.
